


EmPower and ACE Work Focus

PHASE I: DEVELOPED ASEAN RE-GENDER ROADMAP (2022)


PHASE II: COLLABORATING TO ADVANCE THE GENDER RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THE ROADMAP (2023 to date)
